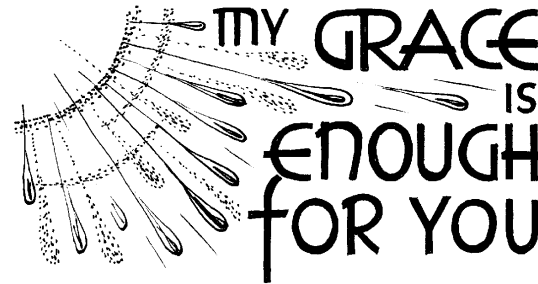

Dear Parishioner,

Over the last few days the temperature has been hovering in the very high 20°C's. It made me think how difficult it would have been for St Paul as he travelled around the different countries in much hotter weather than this, teaching the people he met about Jesus.

We know St Paul was a courageous apostle who travelled far and wide but he suffered dreadfully. He was sent to prison, he was whipped many times once almost to death, he was beaten by sticks, stoned and ship wrecked. On top of all of these things which were done to him he was afflicted by a "thorn in his flesh". There have been many theories as to what exactly this thorn was. So many theories in fact, that it is impossible to diagnose St Paul's situation with complete assurance. But we do know it must have been a medical condition serious enough for him to plead to the Lord three times for it to be removed.

His request was the same as we all have in times of difficulty; we want to rid ourselves of what is causing us pain and suffering. St Paul comes to realise that the problem he has with the thorn in his side is part of how God works in his life.

So this coming week as we continue with the heat wave let's remember St Paul walking around Corinth with that thorn in his side. We face challenge and difficulties in our lives, but as with St Paul, we can always rely on the strength of the Grace of God to help us through our ordeals.
